

**Minutes of Richmond Human Rights Commission (RHRC) Meeting
March 8, 2018**

Chairman Pat Reister presided over the meeting and it was called to order at 7:06 PM.

Chairman called for additions or corrections to the minutes of the February meeting. Being none, a motion for approval was made by Commissioner Gardner and a second by Commissioner Johnson. All were in favor, the minutes were approved.

Old Business: Unity Breakfast

Chair has spoken with pastor at First United Methodist as well as the rep at ECU regarding the loss to the church of 2 carts.

We voted to compensate the church for this mishap, as the whereabouts of the carts cannot be established. The motion was made by Commissioner Lambdin and seconded by Commissioner Jadoon, all were in favor. Commissioner Gardner will attempt to call President Benson at ECU to inform him and review the situation. Commissioner Brown suggests that next year we hire someone to set up and take down so there will be less confusion.

New Business: We reviewed the policy for missing consecutive meetings (attendance). Commissioner Gardner motioned to make the number of missed meetings 3 that would be allowed as a total number for the year and not necessarily 3 consecutive missed meetings.

This motion was tabled after some more discussion. Motion made by Commissioner Lambdin and seconded by Commissioner Gardner.
